

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Happy New Year! I pray as you enter 2021 you are looking forward to the opportunities and blessings God will place before you.

COVID has challenged all of us in new ways this year, but for the most part all went smoothly here at church. That is until around December 13th and what I am calling, *The December Debacle*, when we had several COIVD infections, and many guarantines as a result. Unfortunately, our Creation to the Cross Walk-Through Event was postponed, and all services, including Christmas Eve, were moved to on-line only for a period of time, which was disappointing. However, we will move forward in this 'season of disappointment' and will release the next date for the Creation to the Cross event soon.

Due to the rising COVID cases in our church and community, we are strengthening our protocols when holding events at our facilities. Masks are now mandatory whenever in the building and even when social distanced and seated in the sanctuary. We are asking that masks not be removed unless there is an extenuating health situation. Though I would rather not have the masks mandatory, not doing so would likely lead to having on-line services only, and we want to avoid that if possible. If you do not feel well, are uncomfortable being around others, or are not

comfortable wearing a mask for a lengthy period of time, please join us via live stream.

As a follower of Jesus Christ, I am to be His disciple, seeking to emulate Him in all that I do and growing to be more like Him. Such a task and goal require actions on my part as the Holy Spirit works in me. I want to challenge you to develop a Personal Discipleship Plan this year. Though the elements included should be taken by all of us, they become personal when we fit them into our own schedule and personality. Here are the elements in a 'nutshell' \rightarrow A daily Bible reading & prayer plan; join a Discipleship Group (D-Group), which consists of three-five likeminded persons meeting weekly/ consistently to grow in Christ; attend worship service weekly; attend a small group gathering weekly; find a place of service, weekly; and commit to tithing your income/giving beyond the tithe. Some of these steps are easy; some are difficult. God will use such actions to grow me as a disciple and to impact others around me. Please see me or Pastor Josh for assistance getting started, as well as information that will be posted on-line or around the building.

Daily Prayer plan \rightarrow Set aside a time daily to pray is wise and was modeled by Jesus

Daily Bible reading plan \rightarrow Set aside a time daily to gain a better understanding of God, His commands, and how He works

Join a D-Group \rightarrow Invest time with other followers of Christ in Bible study, prayer, accountability, and sharing life

Attend worship service weekly \rightarrow Corporate worship allows us to engage God with fellow followers of Christ, encourage one another, and learn together

Attend a small group once per week \rightarrow Small groups of different varieties meet throughout the week, on and off the church campus, for Bible study, prayer, encouragement, and serving

Find a place of service within the church or community, once per week \rightarrow Serving leads to spiritual growth because we must rely on God to be effective and stay committed

Commit to tithing and giving beyond the tithe \rightarrow When we give God control of our finances it opens a level of trust that can lead to great growth and honors Him
