

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Community is a word which we use often in our church context. However, depending on the context, it can be defined and applied in two ways, neither of which is wrong, and both of which are important.

We strive for a sense of community within our church family. We want to connect with one another, know one another, and through that support one another. A sense of community is relational in its goal but felt inwardly as we experience it. Community allows us to feel comfortable, welcome, loved, and that we belong. However, community does not just happen. We must work hard at it corporately and personally. We have welcome teams on Sunday mornings to greet people and help them feel welcome and 'at home.' We encourage people to speak to one another, share time together, and not be in a rush to sit down or leave. We have Community Groups and Bible Study Groups of all age groups where smaller numbers can gather, connect, and be ministered to as well as do ministry. Noting how important these connections are, our Next Generation Ministry leaders and Church Lead Team discussed recently how we as a church can gather periodically to connect, and in some ways reconnect, after the fog of COVID. On Sunday evening, October 8th, @ 5:00 p.m., we will have a church-wide game night. We will gather, have time as a large group, and then participate in a time of playing games and visiting with one another. There will be no grand schedule, just time to be together and continue to get to know one another. More

information is located in this newsletter, in our announcements on Sunday morning, and around the building. I truly hope you will join us.

We strive to reach and impact with the Gospel the *community* in which we and our church resides, the people and families that live, work, and play around us. To engage our community, we must be in our community. On October 3rd some of us will operate the concessions stand @ the SYAA baseball fields so parents can watch their children play. On Saturday, October 13th, we encourage each of us to walk around our street and pray for our neighbors. On October 21st we will host a Community Movie Night. These and other actions, like inviting friends and family and neighbors to church, help us fulfill our mission, which is to intentionally engage the world with the love of Christ.

"Our dream is for our community to see us as a first option when they are seeking a church home where they can grow in spiritual maturity, raise and influence their families for Christ, and minister to their neighbors." Seeing the dream become real will require us to build within us a healthy community of Christ, and then individually and corporately reaching into the community that surrounds us. I am looking forward to continue to strive toward community and reaching our community with you.
